WHY A CAMP IN NEW MEXICO?

WHAT IS A TYPICAL DAY?

WHAT KIND OF RECREATION IS OFFERED?

Glorieta is known for the diverse recreation offered. Some activities such as zip lines, dirt trikes, snow tubing, lake activities require scheduled staff to be available. However, throughout campus, there are sports courts, mini golf, ping pong, disc golf, horseshoes, ring toss, gaga ball, etc. for students to use whenever they choose.

WHAT DOES REGISTRATION COVER?

Your registration covers the costs of transportation, housing, meals, fun daily activities, excellent speakers, and a live worship band.

WHAT IS NOT COVERED?

Bring money (\$25+) for 2 meals (lunch on the way to camp and lunch on the way home). Optional: additional spending money to buy snacks, merch, drinks, etc.

HOW ARE CAMPERS HOUSED?

Campers will be housed in dorm halls (separated by biological sex). Each dorm will hold 4-6 students. Dorms each have an in room sink and have a shared toilet and shower area. We will accept friend requests on the registration form. We will do our best to accommodate them with friends, but friend requests are not guaranteed.

*Students will be housed by their biological sex.

*New Mexico state law requires that facilities that host overnight student camps cannot have locking doors in dormitories or cabins. We encourage guests to keep valuable items on their person or to not bring anything with them that is not essential.

MAY I BRING MY CAMPER'S FRIEND(S) TO DROP OFF OR PICK UP?

Yes, you can drop off or pick up other campers, but parents will need to register their own camper(s).

WHAT SHOULD CAMPERS BRING?

Clothes for the week \cdot A modest swimsuit \cdot Pillow; Sleeping bag or fitted sheet & blanket \cdot Toiletries: Deodorant, shampoo, body wash/soap, toothbrush/toothpaste \cdot Extra shoes: flip flops, closed shoes \cdot 2-3 Towels; one for the beach and one for showering \cdot Personal water bottle \cdot Sunscreen \cdot Sunglasses \cdot Hat \cdot Bible, Notebook, Pen \cdot at least \$25 for 2 meals and extra money optional for merchandise & snacks, spending money \cdot Cell Phone Charger

WHAT SHOULD CAMPERS NOT BRING?

 $Gaming\ systems \cdot iPads/Laptops \cdot Any\ tobacco\ products\ or\ Vaping\ Device \cdot Alcohol \cdot Drugs\ \&\ paraphernalia \cdot Firearms\ or\ weapons\ of\ any\ kind$

WHAT IF MY CAMPER HAS MEDICATIONS?

If your camper will be taking medications while at camp (prescribed or daily over the counter), you must bring it to Check-in along with a completed medication form. You must list each medication with instructions on how and when it is to be given. We will have designated staff available to distribute any prescribed and over-the-counter medications and provide any first-aid assistance.

WHAT HAPPENS IF MY CAMPER GETS HURT/INJURED AT CAMP?

In case of injury, our Compass Staff will contact the camper's parent/guardian, as well as seek local medical attention if needed.

WHAT IS YOUR CANCELLATION/REFUND POLICY?

We understand life can be hectic, and we all know plans can change at the last minute. Cancellations will be considered individually. Please understand that when you cancel a registration, we have already done administrative work, hired staff, purchased supplies, paid for insurance, paid for charter buses, and paid for the camp we are attending, all of which are non-refundable. With that in mind, we hope to be fair to our families and to be good stewards of our ministry with our cancellation policies. The first \$100 is non-refundable. Additional refunds will be considered on a case-by-case basis or if every camp spot has been filled.
