Ice Breaker: If you could have a limitless supply of something to give away (except money, food, or clothes – those are too easy!), what would it be and why?

- 1. Stuff doesn't last forever, only people last forever. But our culture is obsessed with the accumulation of stuff. What are some reasons for these misplaced priorities?
- 2. Stuff does not equal significance. How can we fight against the temptation and pressure to "keep up with the Joneses?"
- 3. Saving is not the same thing as hoarding. Are you more of a saver or a spender? If you are more of a saver, how can you fight the temptation to hoard? If you are more of a spender, how can you fight the temptation to squander?
- 4. Wealth does not ensure happiness. Pastor Brian said, "Having more might make your life a little easier. But having more will not make you happier." Is there something you looked forward to, or are looking forward to, like a new job, a raise, a big purchase, etc., that you have put too much hope in to make you happier?
- 5. Prosperity cannot guarantee security. Matthew 16:26 says, "What good will it be for a man if he gains the whole world, yet forfeits his soul?" Why are we so tempted to trust in things rather than God?
- 6. God is the ultimate Giver, and we can't outgive Him. But we can use money and stuff for good, to make a kingdom impact in the lives of others. What are some practical ways we can steward the resources God has entrusted to us for maximum kingdom impact?
