

Mount Sinai – The Mountain of Revelation

Week of March 15, 2026

READ:

Exodus 19:1-20; 20:1-21

Ephesians 4:17-24; 2 Corinthians 5:17; Job 38:1-5; Zechariah 13:9; 1 Peter 1:6-7

Romans 6:5-7; Galatians 5:1; Hebrews 11:26-31; Hebrews 12:28-29

KEY POINTS:

- God brings us to the mountain to reveal our identity – The Israelites were freed from slavery but needed to see who they truly were. In Christ, we are made new creations, called to live as priests, kings, and children of God (Eph. 4:20-24; 2 Cor. 5:17).
- God brings us to the mountain to reveal His identity – God’s presence is awe-inspiring, powerful, and holy. Understanding God fully includes reverence, awe, and awareness of His righteous authority (Heb. 11:26-31; Heb. 12:28-29).
- God brings us to the mountain to burn away what enslaves us – God’s refining fire removes sin and purifies our faith. Freedom from sin is not free; it requires surrender to God’s refining process.
- God brings us to the mountain to show us how to live free – Limits and commandments are for our protection and freedom. True freedom allows us to say “no” to sin and live in obedience and love. The mountaintop is the place where God reveals His vision for us.

QUESTIONS:

- How has God’s identity throughout scripture shaped your relationship with Him? How does God define your identity? How does this affect your actions?
- What part of God’s holiness or power challenges you the most? How can remembering the awe-inspiring nature of God shape your daily choices?

- In what ways are you tempted to live like a “slave” rather than a child of God? How do God’s limits or commands help you live in freedom rather than restriction?
 - How do you respond when God asks you to let go of something comfortable for the sake of obedience?
 - Where in your life do you feel God is refining you through His “fire”? What practical steps can you take this week to live as someone set apart for God?

LIFE APPLICATION:

- Identity Check – Write down ways God has called you to live as a priest, king, or child of God. Where are you still living as a “slave”?
 - Refining Reflection – Identify one area in your life where God’s refining fire is active. How can you cooperate with Him this week? Or identify one season that God refined you and reflect on the good that came out of that season.
 - Freedom Inventory – Look at God’s commandments not as restrictions but as guidelines for true freedom. How can you practice saying “no” to sin in concrete ways?
 - Mountaintop Perspective – Take time to reflect on the bigger picture: how does God’s vision for your life influence your decisions, relationships, and priorities?
