SUPPORTING SCRIPTURE

KEY POINTS

- Some Things Are Meant to Stay Secret - God sees the full picture while we only see a part. Not everything is ours to understand, and God is not obligated to explain everything, but He is always trustworthy.
 - God Has Revealed What We Need - Even without full clarity, God has clearly shown His character and promises. We may not know everything, but we know enough to trust Him.
 - What God Reveals, We Are Responsible to Live Out - Revelation leads to obedience. God's truth is not meant to just be understood; it's meant to be lived. Spiritual growth comes from obeying what God has already revealed.
 - What God Reveals, We Are Responsible to Pass It On - What God reveals is not just for us, it's for the next generation. Faith is both personal and generational.
 - Jesus Is the Secret Revealed - The greatest mystery of God is fully revealed in Jesus. He is the clearest picture of who God is and the answer to our deepest questions.

QUESTIONS

- Can you think of a time when you wanted answers from God but didn't receive them? How did you respond?
- How does Deuteronomy 29:29 change the way you view unanswered questions?

- Why do you think we struggle so much with not knowing the “why”?
 - Which is harder for you, trusting God’s timing, or trusting His silence? Why? What does it practically look like to trust God’s character over your circumstances?
 - How does the story of Job challenge your understanding of suffering and trust?
 - How does seeing Jesus as the “revealed mystery” impact your faith?
 - Are you being obedient to the things God has revealed to you? How does obedience influence your ability to hear God’s voice clearly?

LIFE APPLICATION

- Trust God’s Character Over Your Questions - When you don’t understand what God is doing, anchor yourself in who He is.
 - Shift Focus to What Is Revealed - Stop obsessing over hidden answers and start obeying what God has already made clear.
 - Practice Daily Obedience - Faith grows when we act on what we know, not when we wait for more clarity.
 - Look to Jesus as Your Anchor - In confusion or uncertainty, return to the cross as proof of God’s goodness and plan.
