The Secret of Victory

May 24th, 2026

READ

2 Corinthians 2:14–16

Psalms 68:18 ; Ephesians 4:8 ; Romans 10:15 ; Colossians 2:13–15 ; John 19:30 ; Revelation 12:10 ; 1 John 2:1 ; Romans 8:33 ; Hebrews 7:25 ; 1 Corinthians 4:9 ; Romans 12:1

KEY POINTS

- Jesus Is the Author of Our Victory - Our victory is not rooted in our strength, performance, or circumstances. Our Strength is rooted in Jesus, who has already conquered sin, death, and the grave. Because we are in Christ, we live from victory, not for victory.
- The Cross Looked Like Defeat, but was God's Greatest Triumph - Through the cross, Jesus secured victory over our greatest enemies: death, sin, and Satan. What appeared to be defeat became the ultimate display of redemption and triumph in God's Kingdom.
- Jesus Paid Our Debt in Full - Our sin created a debt we could never repay. Through His sacrifice, Jesus canceled the charge against us and declared it finished. Because of His blood, condemnation no longer defines us; grace, forgiveness, and freedom do.
- Our Lives Should Carry the Aroma of Christ - Paul says believers are the "pleasing aroma of Christ." As we walk in obedience, humility, suffering, and faithfulness, our lives become a witness to others. Some will reject it; others will receive life through it, but our calling is to reflect Christ faithfully.
- Victory in Christ Should Lead Us to Worship and Witness – Us knowing that Christ has already won should change how we live. We are called to stand confidently in His victory, endure hardship faithfully, and carry the good news of Jesus into a world desperate for life.

QUESTIONS

1. How does Christ's victory through the cross challenge the way we naturally define strength, success, and victory?
2. God's Kingdom often reveals power through surrender, suffering, and sacrifice. How have you seen God bring growth, refinement, or victory through a difficult season in your life?
3. Christ has already paid our debt in full, so why do believers still wrestle with guilt, shame, or striving to earn God's acceptance? What truths about Christ or Scripture help anchor us in His finished work?
4. Paul says believers are the "aroma of Christ." What does it practically look like in your life, attitude, and faithfulness to reflect Jesus to others, especially in weakness, suffering, or hardship? What kind of "fragrance" does your life give off to others in this season of your life?
5. Because Christ has already won the victory, how can you live differently in a way that reflects His hope, peace, or love to someone around you? Who in your life may need to experience the victory of Jesus through your encouragement, service, or witness?

LIFE APPLICATION

- Replace Defeat Thinking with Gospel Truth - When shame, fear, or discouragement rises, remind yourself that Jesus has already secured the ultimate victory. Don't allow defeat to define your thinking; speak God's truth over your heart. Memorize Scriptures that anchor you in Christ's victory and recite them when fear, shame, or discouragement begin to take hold.
- Live Like Your Debt Has Been Paid - Stop carrying guilt that Christ already nailed to the cross. Confess sin quickly, receive forgiveness fully, and walk in freedom instead of condemnation.

- Become a Visible Aroma of Christ - Ask yourself: Do my words, attitude, humility, and love reflect Jesus to the people around me? Intentionally represent Christ at home, work, and in relationships this week. Just as a small fragrance can slowly fill an entire room, small daily acts of obedience, kindness, and faithfulness can gradually spread the presence of Christ and leave a lasting impact on others.
- Share the Victory of Jesus - Pray first that God would strengthen your heart to live in the victory of Christ and reveal any areas where fear, shame, or self-reliance still have influence in your life. Then ask Him to place someone on your heart who needs encouragement, hope, or the love of Christ, and be willing to let your life become a visible witness of His victory this week.

PRAYER

Dear Lord,

Thank You for the victory we have in Jesus Christ. Thank You that what looked like defeat at the cross became our salvation, freedom, and life. Help us to live confidently in the truth that our debt has been paid and our hope is secure in You. Let our lives reflect the aroma of Christ in how we love, serve, and endure. Give us courage to walk in Your victory and share that hope with others this week.
